Food for Thought

Habakkuk 2:1

*I will take my stand at the watchpost
and station myself on the tower,
and look out to see what He will
say to me, and what I will answer
concerning my complaint.*

We have a God who is beyond our understanding, yet intimately involved in our lives. He knows each one of our days and His thoughts toward us are more than the grains of sand on the seashores. He spun existence into being and created all we see in the natural realm, yet we falter in so many ways when it comes to seeking and knowing Him.

He says He will never leave us or forsake us, and we live as though He is far from us when He abides in us. Why is it we lose sight of Him and forget that He wants to commune and fellowship with us, this incredible God who has redeemed us and has so much for us? Habakkuk, a guy who God raised up at a particular time in history knew His God, and desired to have this communion with Him.

After rattling off some questions to God concerning the times in which He lived, dark difficult times, he states that he will, “look out to see what He will say to me.” He wants to hear God’s explanation to the questions he just rattled off, and he knows God will answer.

As we consider the beginning of this missions trip, what do you want to hear from God?

What would you like Him to do in your life as you are here serving His people?

Are you surrendered to Him so that He can bend you and shape you as a potter with clay?

As you consider Habakkuk and his willingness to sit and hear what the Lord would say to him, are just as willing to set aside some time to hear His voice?

Motions for Jesus

Jesus is God (Son of God). He came from heaven to earth. Lived a perfect life, died on the cross to pay for our sin, then rose from the dead and is in heaven now offering us the free gift of eternal life (or preparing a place for us or and will one day come again).

In the beginning God... What is God like? People have some strange ideas about God. Some are true and some are not. Let's take a look.

Hat Skit

Policeman: Some people think that God is like a policeman. He always out looking for what you've done wrong so he can write you a ticket and throw you in jail. That's not what God is like.

Firehat: Some people think that God is like a fireman, you just call 911 and he'll put out the fires in your life and then go back to the station and leave you alone. That's not what God is like.

Boss: Some people think that God is like the "big Boss in the sky", and they must work, work, work, to get please him and get to heaven. God is not like that. We cannot work our way to heaven.

Simply Jesus

Fairy godfather: Some people think that God is like a fairy godfather. You just call on him when you want something and he'll wave his magic wand and then 'poof', he's gone.

A Fool: Some people think that God is like a fool because he is so slow to anger, patient and longsuffering.. But the Bible tells us that God is not a fool and He will not be mocked. The Bible says that the real fool is "the man who says in his heart that there is no God!"

Now here are some accurate descriptions of God that we find in the Bible.

Doctor: God is like a doctor. In fact, He is called "The Great Physician," and He is in the business of healing broken hearts and renewing your spirit.

Train engineer: God is like a train engineer. He wants to keep your life on track and bring you safely home to the station.

King: God is like a king, he is the "King of the Universe" and he wants to be the king of your heart.

Hen: God is like a mother hen, who longs to gather us under her wings and care for us.

Captain: God is like the captain of a ship who will guide through the storms of life.

Judge: God is like a judge. He will one day judge the universe and cast out those who have sinned and not been pardoned by the blood of His son. How will you do in that courtroom?

Love: God is love and he has loved us with an everlasting love.

Good King

A long time ago in a far off land there was a wise and just King. A king known far and wide for his love and justice. A famine came to the land, but because the King was wise they had stored food for a time such as this. One day his servant came to him and said, "Good King, someone has been stealing our food!" The King was outraged! How could someone do such a thing. He told the servant to go and tell the people, "Whoever is caught stealing food will be punished severely and given 40 lashes." So the servant went and told the people. Just a few weeks later they caught the thief and dragged the thief to the King. "Oh King, the good news is we have caught the thief! The bad news is that it is your mother!" Oh no. What would the King do? He had a problem. You see, he loved his mother very much and if he punished her she would surely die. But, on the other hand if he didn't punish her, he would no longer be seen as a fair and just leader of his people. What would he do? He had a problem.

He made a decision and called his servant. He said, "Get the whip, the punishment will take place." Just as the servant raised the whip, the King said, "But it is not my mother you will punish. He took off his robes and crown and shirt, and bent his back to the whip, and said, I will take the punishment."

And so love and justice were served that day. It reminds me of another story though. Can you think of another who came and took the punishment that we deserved? Jesus came from heaven and took the punishment for our sins. He paid the debt that we owed.

Coin Illustration:

This coin it reminds me of God. It's shaped like a circle, and a circle had no beginning and no end. God is from everlasting to everlasting, no beginning, no end. It is one coin, yet it has two sides, each side is very different. That's just like God, He is one God with two sides to his nature. One the one hand He loves us and doesn't want to punish us, on the other hand He is just and must punish sin. This coin also isn't worth very much. It reminds me of the good works I do. No matter how much I try, I can't pay the debt I owe because of sin. The price of sin is death and must be paid by a perfect sacrifice. God loved me so much He sent His Son Jesus to pay for my sin so I could be with Him in heaven one day. How do I receive the gift of eternal life God offers? Well, the answer is on the coin. In God we trust. We trust fully on the sacrifice God has provided for us and invite Jesus into our lives as Lord and Savior.

Simply Jesus

Black Fabric Activity (some ways the Bible describes sin)

The Bible describes sin for us many different ways.

This cloth reminds me of sin, its shiny on one side, it looks beautiful and enticing; but on the other side it is really dull and ugly.

- Sin separates us from God.
- Sin leaves us in darkness, the Bible says “men love darkness rather than light because their deeds are evil.”
- Sin blinds us.
- It stops up our ears.
- It keeps us from speaking words of life.
- It binds us.
- It makes slaves of us.
- It trips us up.

But, worst of all, it brings death. The Bible says, “the wages of sin are death but the gift of God is eternal life.” But God made a way. He sent His only Son Jesus to pay the price of our sins with His precious blood. The Bible says, “... the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.” (I John 1:7)

So Jesus’ blood washes us “white as snow”, and now when God looks down from heaven he no longer sees our sin, but Christ’s righteousness.

So, let’s review.

- Our sins are washed white as snow
- By the blood of Jesus
- Who takes away our sin
- So we can be free

James 1:14,15 tempted and enticed

Isaiah 59:2 your sin has separated you from God

John 3:19 Men love darkness rather than light because their deeds are evil.

Proverbs 5:22 entrapped

Hebrews 12:11 entangled

James 4:14, 15 death, blind

Romans 6:23 wages of sin is death

Ephesians 2:1 you who were dead in your trespasses and sins

Hebrews 9:22 “... without shedding of blood there is no remission (payment for sin).”

I John 1:7 “...and the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us from all sin.”

John 1:29 “Behold the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world.”

Team Guidelines

For any missions team, we always request that you abide by the following guidelines:

- No drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sexual or inappropriate relationships.
- No entering the room/sleeping area of any team member of the opposite sex.

1. Authority and Discipline: The Biblical response to authority is obedience. This principle is stated in Hebrews 13:17: “Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you.” Disciplinary action for use of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, any act of immorality, or any act of unsafe conduct will result in participant being sent home at participant’s expense.

2. Unity: We must work closely together in harmony with our brothers and sisters in Christ and before the world. The exhortation over and over again in the Word of God is to show love and brotherly kindness and is a necessary part of team effort. I Peter 1:22 goes a step further. We are to “love

one another with a pure heart fervently,” which means that we are to work at it continually.

3. Dating Within our Group: One area of our lives that we must watch very closely as we live before an unconverted world is our dating. There is to be no personal contact, and we ask that couples who are in a relationship during the trip treat each team member equally and not act as a couple during the trip. We also ask that there be no romantic relationships developed with those we are going to share Jesus with during the trip.

4. Team Building: team unity is an important aspect of any trip. We will be staying in the same location, eating together, studying together, praying together and ministering together as an entire group. The time spent with your team will hold some of your greatest memories.

5. Attitudes: The old proverb “one bad apple can spoil the whole barrel” applies here. While living in a team situation, your attitude can either affect others for better or for worse. Spend time alone with the Lord in His Word and talking honestly with Him in prayer.
